Descriptive Title

Calendar Description:

A progressive study of learning to play the piano for students who possess no previous experience. The course is all technique, keyboard harmony, sight reading, transposition, and the playing of appropriate repertoire. Open to full Basic Musicianship students only.

Course Contents

- a) To recognize and play notes on the staff
- b) To recognize and play notes on leger lines
- c) To recognize and play chords at random
- d) Play short melodies, hands separately and hands together

To transpose simple pieces, hands separately, up or down a major or second and third notes the principles of vertical and horizontal transposition; recognition of intervals and melodic patterns

3.1 Technique

- a) Development of individual finger control, by the use of exercises by Haver, Schmitz, Wied, etc.

Q: Means of Assessment

The grade will be calculated on the basis of progress made in the various aspects of the course.

Based upon regular evaluation (minimum of 11 per week) 60% of the mark will be allocated for a final in-class examination.
35% of the mark will be allocated for a final in-class examination.

Attendance:

As this is a skill-oriented course, regular attendance is required in order to develop fluent keyboard skills.
